Statutory tests w illbe adm inistered in the folbw ing subjects:
o Punctuation, Vocabulary and G ram m ar ( 45 m inutes)
o Speling (approxim ate 1515 m inutes)
o Reading ( 60 m inutes)
OM athem atics

- Paper 1:Arithm etic (30 minutes)
- Paper 2:Reasoning (40 m inutes)
- Paper 3:Reasoning ( 40 m inutes)
- The biennílscience sam pling test w illake place in June 2020.
- As in recent years, w riting w illbe teacher assessed intemally. The revised pupil can' statem ents for English w riting place a greater em phasis on com position and the statem ents that relate to the $m$ ore 'technical' aspects of English writing (gram $m$ ar, punctuation and speling) have been $m$ ade less prescriptive.


## G ram m ar, Punctuation \& Speling

- A speling test is adm inistered containing 20 w ords, which lasts approxin ately 15 $m$ inutes.
- A separate test is given on gram mar, punctuation and vocabulary.
- This test hsts for 45 m inutes and requires short answ er questions including som e multipl choice.
- $M$ arks for these tw o tests are added together to give a totalfor gram mar, punctuation and speling.

## Reading

- The reading test consists of a singl test paperw ith three unrelated reading texts. Chidren are given 60 m inutes in total, w hich includes reading the texts and answ ering the questions.
- A totalof 50 m arks are avaiabl.
- Questions are designed to assess the com prehension and understanding of a child's reading.
- During the reading paper, a chib's inference and deduction skills are thoroughty tested. They w illalso be expected to answ er questions on authorílchoices: explaining why an author has chosen to use particular vocabulary, gram $m$ ar and text features.
- Som e questions are m ultiple choice or selected response; others require short answ ers and som e require an extended response or explanation.

## M athem atics

- Chibren w illsit three tests:paper 1, paper 2 and paper 3 .
-Paper 1 is for arthm etic lasting for 30 m inutes, covering calculation $m$ ethods for alloperations, including use of fractions, percentages and decim als.
-Q uestions gradually increase in difficuly. Not allchidren w illbe expected to access som e of the more difficult questions ber in the paper.
-Papers 2 and 3 coverproblem solving and reasoning, each lasting for 40 m nutes.
-Pupils w illstillrequire calculation skils but w illneed to answ er questions in context and decide w hat is required to find a solution.

## Scaled Scores

W hat is m eant by 'scaled scores'?
I is planned that 100 w illaiw ays represent the nationalstandard'.

Each pupil's raw test score w illtherefore be converted into a score on the scale, ether at, above or bebw 100.

Using the scaled score, the bw est a chid can score is 80 , w ith the highest being 120 .

A child w ho achieves the nationalstandard' (a score of 100) w illbe judged to have dem onstrated sufficient know ldge in the areas assessed by the tests.

Each pupilreceives:
-a raw score (num ber of raw marks aw arded);
-a scaled score in each tested subject;

- confirm ation of w he ther or not they attained the nationalstandard.


## Scaled Score Fxam ples

On publication of the test results in July:

- a child aw arded a scaled score of 100 is judged to have $m$ et the nationalstandard' in the area judged by the test;
- If a chid's score is cbse to 120 , they are w orking beyond (or above) the expected nationalstandard.
-a chid's score is cbse to 80 , they are judged to have not yetmet the nationalstandard and per- form ed bebw the expectation for the ir age.


## How to Hel Your Chibd

- First and forem ost, support and reassure your child that the re is nothing to w orry about and they should aiv ays just try the ir best. Praise and encourage !
- Ensure your chid has the best possible attendance at school
- Support your chid w ith any hom ew ork tasks.
- Reading, speling and arithm etic (e.g.tim es tables) are alw ays good to practise.
- Tak to your chid about w hat they have leamt at schooland w hat book (s) they are reading (the character, the pbt, the ir opinion).
- Encourage opportunities for teling the time.
- During SATs w eek, a good night's skep and a healthy breakfast can m ake allthe difference!
