<u>Attendance:</u>

Our current attendance figure to date is **94.6%** from Reception to Year 6. While this is above National average, we are constantly trying to improve this figure as it is vital that our children are in school as just a days missed learning can create gaps in knowledge and misconceptions.

Fidget Toys


In class we make a number of adjustments for children where we recognise the benefit to their wellbeing or their learning. When we have recognised a specific need, we have agreed for children to have a fiddle item or something from home to support them. We have noticed that children are increasingly bringing their own items in from home for this purpose which have not been agreed with school. These items are at risk of getting lost or damaged and can often cause a distraction to learning. We kindly request that from the beginning of next term, children do not bring any personal items from home unless there has been a specific purpose agreed with the class teacher. The children benefit from 'Calm Boxes' in every class, which Mrs Vaughan-Lewis keeps stocked with items which can provide comfort to children. These are accessible to everyone in the class if needed. If it is identified that a child would benefit from their own fiddle item, we are able to provide one from our school supply. These items therefore do not need to be provided from home.

Crochet club have been busy! We have been crocheting a square and then with some clever sewing, we turned our squares into rabbits and just in time for Easter holidays!
