### Communication via Dojo



We are very fortunate to have Class Dojo as a communication tool between teachers and parents. Whilst it is a fantastic tool, please do be aware that staff are not expected to respond to Dojo messages after 6pm and do have 48 hours to respond to any message sent. Please also remember that whilst it is an online tool, there is a person (usually the class teacher) receiving the message. With the start of term, a small number of the communication received has not

### Pupil Premium




#### Car Park

We know that the car park is always very busy at drop off and pick up times. We run a 'Kiss and Drop' service in the layby at the top end of the car park. Please always park considerately and do not block other cars. We ask politely that **ONLY** vehicles with disabled badges park in the disabled bays as we have children and parents with genuine need. Just as a clarification to new

parents and a reminder to our existing parents - visitor/parent parking is ONLY as you drive into the carpark on the right-hand side before the barriers - any parking after the Kiss & Drop area is for staff only. Cars will not be permitted to park or stop outside a marked bay. Pick up and drop off areas eg. Kiss and Drop and the Coach bay are specifically for that, they are not waiting spaces. Please see picture overleaf.

The visitor and parent pick up/drop off section has in excess of 100 spaces and should be more than sufficient to remove the need to stop anywhere else. We are a community school and the majority of our pupils are from within a 1-mile radius of the schools. The schools are served by good walking/footpath links and we would actively encourage you to consider if there is a need to drive at all. Your help and support are much appreciated, this is for the safety and wellbeing of your children.



### School Lunches

Sodexo have requested that ALL meals are ordered for the week by THURSDAY evening on ParentPay. This includes children receiving Universal Free School Meals (Rec-Year 2) and Free School Meals. If meals are not ordered in advance, you will receive a text to bring your child in a packed lunch.



We politely request that no nuts are brought into school in lunch boxes as we do have children with severe allergies that can be life threatening. This includes peanut butter which we <u>do not</u> allow in sandwiches. This also includes Nutella. As we promote healthy eating, please also do not send sweets in lunchboxes. Thank
